Master of Health Care Administration (M.H.A.)

Full-time graduate enrollment is normally 9-12 credits per semester. Depending upon the individual degree requirement, full-time graduate students may normally expect to complete degree requirements in two years while part-time students may normally expect to complete degree requirements in four years. A typical three credit-hour course normally requires three hours of classroom instruction plus additional reading and research per week over a semester period.

Financial aid is available.

Visit www.georgiasouthern.edu/admissions to apply for graduate admission or call 912-478-5384. Applicants must follow the admission procedures specified in the University catalog, College of Graduate Studies Web site or listed at the degree program Web site.

Once you have submitted your application and \$50 application fee, you will need to submit the following:

- Official transcripts from each college/university attended
- Official admission test scores such as GRE, GMAT or MAT as required by your graduate program
- Supplementary application documents as required by your graduate program*

*International applicants must also provide official evaluation of transcripts through a professional evaluation agency and TOEFL scores***

* Many programs require the applicant to present a statement of purpose, career goals and objectives as part of the application package. Examine the department program Web page and/or contact the program director for specific guidelines.

** The TOEFL will be waived for students who have graduated from a U.S. college or university.
